Following the huge success of Saltmarsh series on The Sea, we return with a look at the built environment of this special coastline.

Presentations, discussions and exhibitions on

the architectural treasures (or otherwise) of North Norfolk; the past, present and future of its historic buildings; its architecture; housing; impact on landscape; policies and practice; and what the future could (or should) hold.

Thursday 18th July

A Place to Call Home: Access to housing in north Norfolk; economic, social and cultural implications of recent trends and developments and where local authorities and businesses fit in.

Thursday 17th October

Holkham Hall: Illustrated presentation/lecture by Christine Hiskey, author of 'Holkham' and winner of prestigious EDP/Jarrold East Anglian Book (History and Tradition) Award for 2017.

Thursday 15th August

Wells As Was: Presentation and exhibition of previously unseen paintings from a private collection of Wells-next-the-Sea by 19th and 20th century local artists.

Thursday 21st November

Here Comes the Judge: Planning decisions and changes in the built environment; roles of and relationships between planning authorities; roles of civic organizations and citizens in planning processes; resourcing decisions and appeals.

Thursday 19th September

Innovation and Landscape: Presentations and discussion on the impact of historical and current innovations in agriculture, commerce, energy and industry on the built environment.

Thursday 12th December

We the People: What civic organizations and individuals have done and are doing to change and protect the built environment. Examples from Friends of North Norfolk, Norwich Society and Council for the Preservation of Rural England.
